2. Enrollment Quota

The enrollment quota open for each program is to be determined based on the combined number of both enrollment shortages from the 2019 Doctorate Degree Program Admission and students who have withdrawn from their doctoral and integrated master-doctoral degree programs.

3. Requirements

- a. Those who apply for admission to the third semester of the Integrated Programs must already or will have: (A) completed at least 2 semesters in a Master's program (including transfer semesters) and (B) earned at least 12 credits with a GPA of at least 3.5 by the end of the semester currently in progress.
- b. Those who apply to be admitted to the fourth semester of the Integrated Programs must already or will have: (A) completed at least 3 semesters in a Master's program (including transfer semesters) and (B) earned at least 18 credits with a GPA of at least 3.5 by the end of the semester currently in progress.

* Note

- Those who have completed or are planning to finish the coursework in their Master's programs will be deemed ineligible; and
- Those applying for the Departments of Sociology, Political Science and International Relations, and Education require a minimum GPA of 4.0; and those applying for the Departments of Biotechnology, Life Sciences, Biosystem and Biotechnology, and Integrated Biomedical and Life Sciences require a minimum GPA of 3.8.
- c. Only those in a full-time Master's Program (Students of Academy-Research-Industry Collaboration Programs included) are eligible.
- d. Those who received a recommendation from their academic advisor.
- e. Those failing to meet the requirements (credits, GPA, etc.) specified in (a) and (b) upon the completion of the semester in progress at the time of application will be disqualified for admission even if they have already received notice of acceptance.

* Note

- ① Applicants for the Department of Education require a minimum TOEFL (iBT) score of 81 in addition to fulfilling requirements (a) through (d).
- 2 Applicants may apply for a program in the same field in their



Master's program (except for Political Science and International Relations, Economics): and foreign students who are Military Personnel designated by the Ministry of Education or Global Korea Scholarship winners, are not eligible to apply for *extra-quota admission beyond the regular quota*.

③ The Department of International Business has been integrated into the International Business Studies of the Department of Business Administration, and students majoring in the Business Analytics program of the Department of Business Administration are not eligible to apply for the Integrated Programs.

- b. Undergraduate and Graduate Transcripts (indicating credits and grades earned for two or more semesters in a Master's Program), one (1) copy of each
 - * Undergraduate transcripts are *not* required for applicants to the Departments of Economics and of Statistics
- c. Statement of Purpose, one (1) copy
- d. Recommendation Letter from an academic advisor, one (1) copy
- e. Publications and other research results, one (1) copy of each
- f. Certified foreign language test score report, one (1) copy (*Original copy of the score report must also be presented to verify the duplicate copy to be submitted as application material)

5. Candidate Evaluation

- : Preliminary document screenings & face-to-face oral interviews
- Applicants for the Department of Sociology are required to take a written test instead of an oral interview.
- Applicants for the Departments of Economics, Statistics, and Mathematics are to be evaluated solely based on their application



materials submitted (no interviews or written tests)
