- Students waiting to retake, or who have not yet taken (GETE015)'Thinking & Writing I' should register for (GEWR001)'College Writing' for International Students.
- Students waiting to retake, or who have not yet taken (GETE016)'Thinking & Writing II' should register for (SPFL131)'Advanced College Writing' for International Students. This course is considered a General Elective course, but will be acknowledged as a General Education course upon graduation.
- As it is essential that students register for the course that most closely suits their Korean language level, students who have not submitted a certificate of Korean

Proficiency must complete the Korean Placement test given at the beginning at the semester to be able to register.

- Students must complete both (GEWR001)'College Writing' for International Students and (SPFL131)'Advanced College Writing' for International Students to satisfy graduation requirements. Completing, for example, just (GEWR001)'College Writing' does not satisfy graduation requirements.
- (GEWR001)'College Writing' and (SPFL131)'Advanced College Writing' are open both regular semesters.
- ※ These changes will apply to transfer students admitted through the special screening process based on their Student Numbers. (For Example: Transfer Students admitted to Korea University in the Spring of 2020 but have 2018 in their student ID should also take (GEWR001)'College Writing' and (SPFL131)'Advanced College Writing'.)
